- [Move to set up tech institutes in State](#)

Bhubaneswar: In an effort to create technical manpower of international standard in the State to cater to the upcoming steel plants, the State Government has decided to establish training institutes on steel industry at Paradip and Jharsuguda.

It has also been decided to submit a proposal to the Centre for setting up of an institute in the Kalinganagar industrial complex at Duburi in Jajpur district on the lines of Biju Patnaik Steel Institute in Puri.

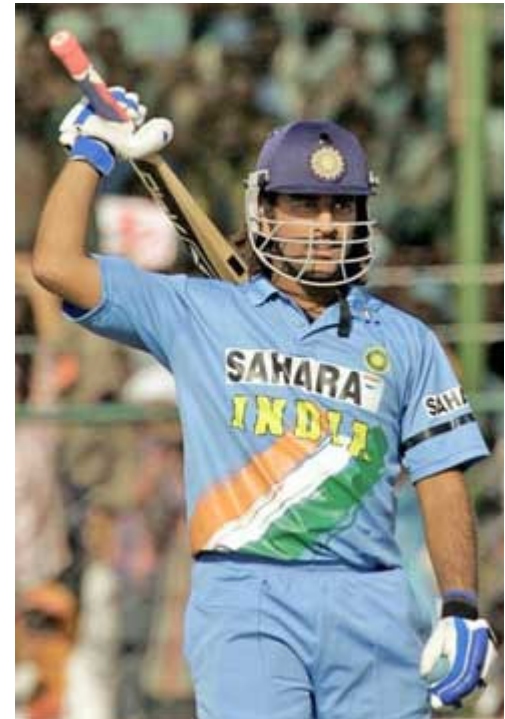
Reviewing the recently launched State Employment Mission at high-level meeting at State Secretariat here on Saturday, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik said that it would not only cater to the needs of mega industries coming up in the State but also help students avail employment opportunities in the country and abroad.

There are six government-run engineering colleges, 13 polytechnics and 24 industrial training institutes in the State.

Teaching standards would be upgraded and sophisticated equipment would be provided to these institutes with the assistance of World Bank and big industries, the Chief Minister maintained.

Training would be imparted to the graduates from the technical institutions for another 6 months to upgrade their skill. For the next four years, 10,000 youths will be trained on advanced technology as part of the skill upgradation programme, Patnaik added.

A special cell would be opened at the office of the Industrial Promotion and Investment Corporation Limited (IPICOL), the nodal agency for industrialisation in the State, to

coordinate efforts for the establishment of downstream projects to supply components to the Hindustan Aeronautic Limited (HAL) at Sunabeda which will manufacture Sukhoi-30 fighter aircrafts.

The state government will provide land for the establishment of a central tool room at Rayagada to cater to the needs of ancillary projects to come up at Sunabeda and neighbouring areas. A branch of Central Institute of Plastic Engineering & Technology will also be opened there.

An apparel park will be set up at Bhubaneswar for the development of garment industry in the state. To fulfill the technical needs of the proposed apparel park, it was decided to upgrade the Institute of Textile Technology at Choudwar.

The State Bank of India has also agreed to set up training centres at six places across the state for skill upgradation of the weavers and artisans and providing them with credit for self employment, officials said.
