Shifting of NIS unacceptable : CM to PM

Bhubaneswar: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on Friday wrote a letter to Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, stating that the Centre's move to shift the proposed National Institute of Sciences (NIS) from Bhubaneswar to Kolkata is "unacceptable". Mr Patnaik pointed out that the people have reacted strongly to the move.

A PIL has also been filed in the Orissa High Court against the move, he pointed out. The Chief Minister stated that the land required for establishment of NIS has already been identified. The Centre should respect the decision of the NDA Government in July, 2003 to set up the institute in Bhubaneswar.


